HOUSE COMPETITION CAPTAIN AND VICE CAPTAIN QUALIFICATIONS AND CONSIDERATIONS

Premise:

The role of a house captain or vice-captain is a role of leadership within the student body. It requires a student to lead and inspire their house for the entire school year. This means that any prospective house captain or vice-captain must meet certain requirements and demonstrate specific attributes if they have a desire to be considered for the role of captain or vice-captain.

1. Requirements:

- a) Must say all the memory passages.
- b) Must have attended all 4 of the previous years House Competitions and demonstrated an active involvement on the day. (illness and special circumstances are to be considered)
- c) Active and spirited involvement in the practice and delivery of the House Chant.
- d) Respectful to teachers, students and the whole school community.
- e) Be able to interact with students in a calm and humble attitude.
- f) Demonstrated an ability to lead their peers and treat all students with respect.
- g) Attends school on-time on a regular basis.
- h) Follows all school guidelines with regards to uniform.

2. Desirable Attributes:

- a. Active participation in school events. Including but not limited to:
 - End of Term Quiz
 - End of Term Volleyball
 - High School Camp
 - Spring Fair
 - Special Days
- b. A good work ethic both academically and when called upon to complete tasks within the school
- c. A positive example to other students both academically and behaviourally
- d. Show initiative to be a servant. Meaning not always waiting to be asked to complete a task, but seeking an opportunity to be of service
- e. Demonstrated self-control in stressful situations.
- f. Excellent classroom behaviour
- g. Excellent classroom participation
- h. Active and positive involvement in Physical Education Classes and general Sport Classes.
- i. Be able to work with students from all ages



All the requirements and desirable attributes must be maintained for the duration of your time as a House Captain or Vice-Captain.

3. Removal as House Captain or Vice-Captain

There are certain events or behaviours that will lead to you being removed as a House Captain or Vice-Captain.

- a. Continual behavioural events that lead to regular detentions and afternoon detentions
- b. In-school or regular suspension will lead to the immediate removal as House Captain or Vice-Captain
- c. Cheating during a House competition
- d. Treating students with continued disrespect during chant practice or house competitions
- e. Poor performance of duties as House Captain or Vice-Captain

4. Responsibilities of Being a House Captain or Vice-Captain

- a. Wear your house badge each day
- b. Prepare a team chant that is 3-4 minutes long with the actions, obtain parent permission for any dangerous movements
- c. Prepare a movement routine for the chant
- d. Be an excellent example to all students inside and outside of school

Your life outside of school must continue to reflect the values of the school. Should you become involved in a lifestyle that the school does not approve of, you will be removed as a House Captain. Activities including but not limited to: drunkenness (whether you are 18 or not), any form of immoral physical activity, taking of illegal drugs, posting of inappropriate media on any social media platform and any general behaviour that brings the school's reputation into disrepute.
